were open to answering to our questions, either due to lack of time or simply not wanting to interact. Fortunately, there were some willing to take a few minutes of their time to answer our questions. When we returned to the meeting place, I could experience how people with autism perceive certain noises around them. It was a wonderful experience, and I'm glad I haven't missed it." "Many times we don't realize how privileged we are from many perspectives compared to people with disabilities. The fact that we have the right to education and that we are easily integrated into society is part of our normalcy, but unfortunately, not theirs. Today, on the occasion of World Autism Awareness Day, we gathered with the aim of breaking down the barriers between us and them because, in the end, we are all humans."
